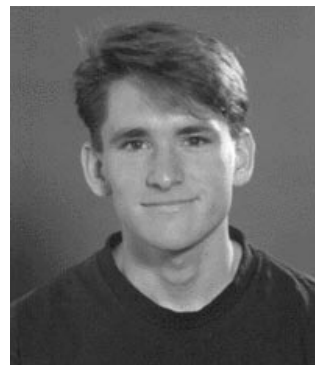

EDUCATIONAL OUTREACH

My name is **Chris Deards** and as Director of Educational Outreach, it is my responsibility to advise and help SEDS chapters with their educational outreach projects and ideas. I also work with other national space organizations like NASA and NSS to develop educational outreach program packages that can be distributed to all the SEDS chapters and go toward helping them establish a better organized educational outreach program. For this term/year, I am working with the National Space Society and N.A.S.A. to develop an educational outreach package. With the help of Jeff Foust who is the Educational Outreach Chair for MIT SEDS and the Boston NSS, we are developing an educational package with Mars as a theme for obvious reasons. I hope to distribute this educational package to other SEDS chapters as soon as its done. For the time being I recommend that chapters who do not have an educational outreach chair position establish one immediately and start working on your own ideas of reaching out to your community.

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Robert Pearlman is the new Vice Chair for SEDS-USA. Originally from New Jersey, Rob is currently attending the University of Maryland in College Park where he is working toward his English degree. He was one of the six founding members of Maryland SEDS, and is currently serving as President of the growing chapter. Rob was recently hired by the National Space Society to serve as Online Manager at their headquarters in Washington, DC.

While new to the national arena, Rob has already started planning on how he would like to make an impact on the organization. Focusing on the "common goal," he would like to see SEDS extend itself to become both an integral part of the growing non-profit, pro-space community and still provide a strong, independent voice for students interested in the future of space exploration. He wants to see SEDS stabilize itself, and remove the rumors of its eventual disbandment simply because it is organized by students. Finally, he wants to see a strong showing at the 1997 SEDS Conference, an event he is responsible for organizing. Every chapter should be represented, and that should include more than just the President or Secretary, but members as well.



As a chapter president, Rob realizes one of the most important resources to chapters is a strong communications tool. If an event is extremely successful at one campus, it is very possible it will do the same for another. He wants to see "local" chapters work together more on both large and small projects. He also would like to see a set "new chapter" package created, to help facilitate the creation of more groups.

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A few weeks ago a couple of SEDS alums and I got together to start actively helping SEDS and its chapters any way we can. SEDS has 16 years of Alumni so we have a wealth of information, experience, contacts, and sometimes even money to help you out with your chapters' projects. Although we're starting with a handful of SEDS alums who just can't get enough of SEDS, we're actively tracking down all of our old SEDShead friends from across the country. In fact, one of our main projects for this year is to track down as many people as we can and add them to our mailing list. If you know of anyone who's just graduated, thinking about graduating, or hoping to graduate soon, please make sure we have all their contact info!

Alumni Scholarship The other project for this year is to start an Alumni Scholarship to be named in memory of Todd Hawley who was very active in SEDS in the early 80's and was one of the founders of International Space University (ISU). We're currently in the middle of outlining what the scholarship will be and planning a fundraising drive to get enough money to have a nice scholarship to hand out in about 2 years.

Get Your Chapter on Cable! One immediate and exciting benefit from keeping alumni around is already here. Amy Houts who rose to SEDS fame by starting the first high school SEDS chapter at Riverview High School in Sarasota, Florida, now works at Inside Space, the space exploration program on the cable SciFi Channel. 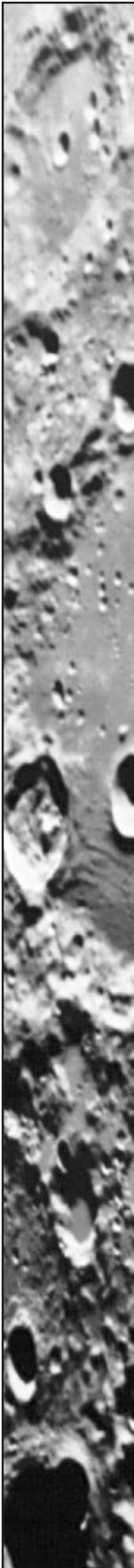

CONFERENCE

The Space Frontier Foundation will bring together businessmen, scientists, members of Congress, astronauts and futurists at its 5th annual conference, at Space FrontierCon V. Scheduled for Oct. 18-20 at the Hollywood Roosevelt Hotel, conference themes include how America can achieve cheap access to space and how innovative businesses such as space tourism can help establish the first commercial hub for private citizens to live and work there.

Conference sessions include progress of the first commercial companies in space, how asteroids may be a viable natural resource, and how to turn NASA's International Space Station into the heart of a commercial center on the frontier. Attending the conference will be such luminaries as: Gemini/Apollo/Skylab astronaut Pete Conrad, head of Universal Space Lines; Congressman George Brown (D-Colton), Ranking Minority Member of the House of Representatives' Science Committee; and Dr. Robert Zubrin, a leading advocate for the exploration and settlement of Mars.

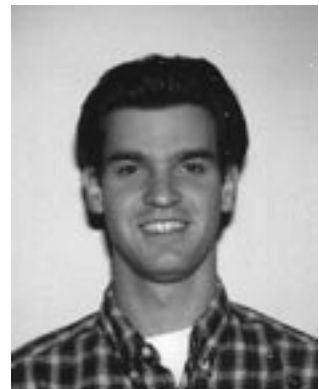
